# Passover Overview

- Please note we keep Passover as a Memorial in remembrance of what Yah did for our people we are practicing for when we can keep it in the Kingdom.
- AKA Pesach in Hebrew
- A commemoration of the freedom of Hebrew people from Egyptian slavery and celebration of us becoming a people.
- In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at dusk is Yah's Passover. And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the Yah; seven days ye shall eat unleavened bread. In the first day ye shall have a holy convocation; ye shall do no manner of servile work. And ye shall bring an offering made by fire unto the Yah seven days; in the seventh day is a holy convocation; ye shall do no manner of servile work. ([Leviticus 23:5-8](#))
- **Passover, Shavuot and Sukkot** are the three biblical pilgrimage festivals that celebrate the seasonal harvests: spring, summer and fall. Pilgrimage festivals are when you go up, march or ascend to Jerusalem and there are psalms of ascent that are sung during this time. The songs are sung call and response like traditional gospel music.

# Passover Overview



- Passover found in the Book of Exodus 12
- Passover is a **Covenantal Meal** and those who partake in it are saying they are a part of Israel, be careful of participating in Passover without getting right with Yah. Once you participate in Passover you are responsible to follow Yah's covenant commandments.
- **Numbers 9:13:** But if anyone who is ceremonially clean and not on a journey fails to celebrate the Passover, they must be cut off from their people for not presenting the Yah's offering at the appointed time. They will bear the consequences of their sin.

Passover-Drinking the Wine Together to Start Engagement

The 4 cups of wine for Passover shows the wine in the covenant process between Yah and Israel.

# Passover & Prophecy

- Some scholars say Passover could be the time of Yahshua's burial and resurrection. This is a time of redemption, liberation, separation or judgement prophetically.
- Are you ready to leave Egypt?
- Last year during the Passover: Black Church was burned in New Orleans, Norte Dame Cathedral Burned, Mosque in Israel Burned, Sir Lanka Church of Zion bombed.
- A time of reaping what you have sown in the previous year and bringing your offering (The First Fruits).
- Many Hebrews did not leave during the Exodus: The Bassa of Cameroon & The Masai of Kenya.

# Passover Overview



- Other Scriptures about Passover Joshua 5:10, Luke 22:15, John 3: 1-3, Numbers 9: 1-5, Leviticus 23: 4-8, Deuteronomy 16:1-8, John 2:13-23, Matthew 26: 17-28 and Mark 14:12-25
- Yah's protection, liberation, providence and deliverance are themes of Passover.
- Moses like his ancestor Joseph is (through Yah's) providence preserved in Pharaoh's household to later liberate his people.
- As so-called Black people we already know Passover celebrating freedom from slavery but freedom from American slavery wasn't the first time Yah freed us.

# Passover Overview



- The Exodus is kicked off by the cries or wails of the Hebrew people reaching Yah in Exodus 3: 7-8 showing that we must cry out to Yah so we can be freed from our current captivity and scattering.
- Exodus 3:7-8 Yah said, “I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey...

# Passover Overview



- The Hebrews are instructed to cover their doors with lamb's blood so that the killing of the first born son passes them.
- First born sons represent passing on of a family line, family values, a culture and so by taking the first born sons Yah is coming against the values of Egypt.

# Passover & Wedding Connections



- Passover is the **courtship**, Shavuot is the **betrothal** when the bride and groom commit themselves to each other in a covenantal relationship. Shavuot celebrates the giving of Torah which serves as the ketubah, or wedding contract between Yah & Israel.
- Many assemblies today reenact this symbolism when taking the Torah out of the ark on Shavuot morning, decorating a chuppah (marriage canopy) with flowers, and even reading a "ketubah" binding Yah and the Hebrew people together.
- Sukkot the 3rd pilgrimage feast is the **wedding super** or celebration.
- Tradition to read Song of Songs on Passover to celebrate Yah's love for Hebrews.

# Passover & Wedding Connections



- Finally undergirding all is love of Yah. Moses says to Pharaoh, "I shall not see your face again," for Pharaoh's is the face of hatred. At the end of the Torah we learn that Moses saw Yah face to face. Yah's is the countenance of love.
- The Exodus is the story of going to Sinai, which our elders compared to a huppah, a wedding canopy, and the Torah is the ketubah, the marriage covenant. Passover reminds us that at the heart of the Hebrew story is the deep yearning of Yah and human beings for one another.
- When the Hebrews cross the sea that's similar to the Mikvah the bride and groom do before getting married. It also represents being reborn.


# Passover & Threshold Covenants

- Zechariah 12:2: Behold, I will make Jerusalem a **cup** of trembling unto all the people round about, when they shall be in the siege both against Judah and against Jerusalem.
- The word "cup" in that verse is not as accurate as the Hebrew. The Hebrew word for "cup" in that verse is actually "saf" (Sawf). From H5605 in the Strong's, in its original sense of containing; a vestibule (as a limit); also a dish (for holding blood or wine): - a basin, bowl, cup, door (as in doorpost), gate, post, or a **THRESHOLD**.
- In ancient times, and even today in the Middle East, there is a custom called "The Threshold Covenant" which is where people make covenants with one another by putting the blood of an animal (kosher animal in our case) at the threshold of the door.
- For those who do not know what a threshold is, it is the bottom part of your doors that people step over to enter into your homes. In the eastern world, the threshold was the most sacred part of the entire house. It was where covenants were made with one another and also with deities (the gods or the god of the home).
- This is why you need to be careful of who you invite to your home.

# Passover & Threshold Covenants


- Do you all remember the Passover account? YHWH told Israel to put blood (of a lamb) on the doorposts and mantel. This was a sign of the covenant. We are used to seeing a basin as a bowl we hold in our hands.
- However in ancient times, the basin (the hole) was built into the threshold of the door so you could put the blood into the threshold, and then put it on the doorposts. Passover represents a threshold covenant!
- So let's re-read **Zechariah 12: 2** correctly: Behold, I will make Jerusalem a threshold of trembling unto all the people round about, when they shall be in the siege both against Judah and against Jerusalem.
- In other words, Jerusalem is the anointed place where Messiah will reign, and where YHWH has placed His Name. It is the threshold of His "house". So this means something; this is important. Those who cross over it with evil intent in their hearts show that they despise His covenant, and they will become like the cut up pieces of the animals that were killed. This is heavy duty covenant language.
- If Jerusalem is the threshold of YHWH where the covenant is made with all nations, then what blood was shed at that "threshold" to regather us back to His covenant? Yeshua, should have come to mind. Yeshua was sent as the Lamb of YHWH whose blood was shed in Jerusalem (the threshold of YHWH) so that we can be renewed into His covenant and be Israel again.

# Passover & Threshold Covenants



- In the Ancient Near East when you as a guest crosses a threshold which would have animal blood placed on it by your host you were protected by that house and provided for. When the Hebrews put blood on their doorpost they were in covenant with Yah to receive his protection and provision those who did not do this were not protected and died.
- Hollywood has stars walk down the red carpet this is a corruption of the threshold covenant and is why when you get to walk down a red carpet you are taken care of by Hollywood. Once you step on that red carpet you become the special guest of the event which is why celebs receive security, etc.
- When politicians visit other countries they get off a plane and walk on a Red carpet which means the country has to take care of the politician.
- In Liberia and other places where Hebrews reside in Africa a fowl is killed and its blood sprinkled on the door when welcoming a new guest, once that guest walks across the threshold you are responsible for him or her.

# Passover & Threshold Covenants



- When a Husband carries a wife over the threshold he is saying he will be a provider, protector and do everything to his strength to protect her.
- Book of Zechariah 14: 4-5 states: On that day his feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, east of Jerusalem, and the Mount of Olives will be split in two from east to west, forming a great valley, with half of the mountain moving north and half moving south. You will flee by my mountain valley, for it will extend to Azel. You will flee as you fled from the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah. Then the LORD my God will come, and all the holy ones with him.
- This split is a threshold that Yah's bride will be carried across during The Greater Exodus when we are regathered to our land. This is also similar to the parting of the sea during the first Exodus.
- **Passover is Yah inviting us to a threshold covenant with him to come into the Household of Israel.**

# First Fruits

- Usually we say we are celebrating Passover as one feast but actually three set apart times: **Passover, First Fruits & Feast of Unleavened Bread.**
- **Leviticus 23:9-12** And the Yah spoke unto Moses, saying, Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When ye be come into the land which I give unto you, and shall reap the harvest thereof, then ye shall bring a sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest unto the priest: And he shall wave the sheaf before Yah, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it. And ye shall offer that day when ye wave the sheaf an he lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering unto Yah.
- Thank Yah for his Harvest in your life.

# Feast of Unleavened Bread

- *Exodus 23:15* "Celebrate the Festival of Unleavened Bread; for seven days eat bread made without yeast, as I commanded you. Do this at the appointed time in the month of Aviv, for in that month you came out of Egypt. "No one is to appear before me empty-handed.
- The **Feast of Unleavened Bread** is the first appointment in the year designated by Yahweh our God to meet with Him in a holy convocation. The festival in itself extends over seven days with the first and the last days being high Sabbaths in which no work is done and it is commenced by the Passover memorial. The instruction to observe this feast was given in relation to Passover and is linked to it and is a continuation of it.
- Passover starts the first night of not eating leaven. Leaven represents a corrupting influence or sin in your life.

# Preparing Physically



- We are commanded to rid our homes of leaven which is a substance used in dough and batters that cause them to rise. Example: Yeast **Exodus 12:19-20**
- You do not just store leaven outside of your home to bring it back after Passover but you totally get rid of it by giving it away or throwing it away. Leaven represents sin so we would not repent of a sin for Passover and start it again when the feast ends.
- **Examples of leaven:** Baker's Yeast, baking powder or soda, cream of tartar, sourdough, ammonium carbonate, potassium carbonate, potassium bicarbonate, dipotassium carbonate, bread, cookies, bleached flour.



## Preparing Physically

- Many take the pre-Passover cleaning time to do spring cleaning.
- Search for bread crumbs under furniture, in the pockets of your clothes, etc.
- Empty and scrub down entire fridge, cleaning your stove.
- Washing dishes. You may choose to have separate dishes for Passover.

## Preparing Physically

- Buy foods with Kosher for Passover certification this sometimes is a K.
- Most supermarkets will have Kosher sections for Passover.
- Items that can't be eaten:
- **Wheat**  
**Oats**  
**Rye**  
**Barley**  
**Spelt**

## Preparing Physically

- You can have a Passover Seder in your home during The Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- Tikkun: you can donate to or volunteer with an organization working for the liberation of our people.
- You can watch the Prince of Egypt with your children.
- You can plan a Passover shopping trip with friends or family.
- Watch films on various times Yah freed his people: The Exodus, American slavery, Apartheid, etc.

# Preparing Spiritually

- We are commanded to remove leaven and search it out because leaven is a corrupting agent and so these physical activities mirror the spiritual cleansing of sin in our lives. First the natural then the spiritual.
- A scripture to guide this process is **Psalm 139: 23-24**
- **1 Corinthians 5:7:** Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch—as you really are. For Messiah, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.
- Remove Leven (Sin) from our hearts and Repent.
- Ask Yah to search you and reveal what sins your enslaved to that you need to be liberated from.
- For each sin that is revealed google scripture concerning that sin example: scriptures on gossip and read those scriptures.



## Preparing Spiritually

- Make a list of people you need to forgive. Some of us keep people in bondage through unforgiveness. Yah can't forgive you until you forgive others.
- Everyday during prayer ask Yah to help you forgive, verbally say you forgive the person through the power of Yahshua the Messiah and pray for the person.
- If it's safe and would not harm the person or you have a conversation to reconcile. If the person abused you or is unrepentant forgive but do not attempt to meet for reconciliation. You can forgive even if someone has passed.
- Cry out to Yah concerning the oppression of our people The Exodus story shows when enough Hebrews cry out Yah will deliver!
- If you clean the leaven from your home but not your heart you wasted this feast season.



## Preparing Mentally



- Freedom for our people is central to Passover but sadly many of us have been in captivity so long even if we were placed back in our land we would bring Babylon with us.
- Yah had to give us the commandments in the wilderness so that we knew how to live as freed people.
- You can be physically free but still mentally enslaved. Our wilderness lasted 40 years due to this.
- Are you mentally ready to be free or as Yahshua asked the man needing healing are you ready to be made whole? **John 5:6**
- In the wilderness some of us asked to return to Egypt because there was meat in Egypt? Many of us return to the bondage of sin because some appetite is being met by the sin. **Exodus 16: 3**

# Preparing Mentally

- This Passover ask Yah to reveal to you the ways in which you have internalized our oppression and captivity and ask Yah to give you a mind for freedom.
- Our Hebrew Bassa Brothers in Cameroon know from their ancestors the dangers of slave mentality during a time of Exodus listen to their history:
  - The name Bassa in the Bantu language means “conquerors”.
  - According to Frederick, the Bassa immigrated to Africa from Egypt thousands of years ago with Melek, their chief and one of the great grandsons of Judah, son of Jacob. The Bassa oral tradition describes Melek as a military chief in the Egyptian army who chose to stay behind to protect his privileges rather than to follow the uncertain journey espoused by Moses. However, when Melek learned of the death of Pharaoh's army at the Red Sea, he feared the Egyptians would take revenge against the Hebrews who had remained behind. With the rest of the Israelites gone, Melek led his family and followers from Egypt. First, they traveled south along the Nile, but eventually moved westward, crossed Nigeria, and entered Cameroon.
  - The Bassa got free but missed the miracle of the sea parting, the manna and the giving of the commandments.

# Preparing Mentally

- When you do not follow Yah on time you miss his miracles.
- We are not to judge the Bassa we love them and support them BUT let their history serve as a grave warning.
- Break the chains of mentally slavery now!!!
- Ask Yah to help you love Zion and lose your attraction to Babylon.

# The Midwives



**Exodus 1: 15-22:** The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah,<sup>16</sup> “When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, if you see that the baby is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, let her live.”<sup>17</sup> The midwives, however, feared Yah and did not do what the king of Egypt had told them to do; they let the boys live.<sup>18</sup> Then the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and asked them, “Why have you done this? Why have you let the boys live?”<sup>19</sup> The midwives answered Pharaoh, “Hebrew women are not like Egyptian women; they are vigorous and give birth before the midwives arrive.”<sup>20</sup> So Yah was kind to the midwives and the people increased and became even more numerous.<sup>21</sup> And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families of their own.<sup>22</sup> Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: “Every Hebrew boy that is born you must throw into the Nile, but let every girl live.”

# The Midwives



- The Midwives disobedience allowed Moses to be preserved. These women played a key role in Yah's redemption of the Hebrew women as did Moses Mother and even Pharaoh's daughter showing that Yah has always used women.
- Today Hebrew boys are killed or locked up and though left alive the Hebrew woman suffers with her brother (protection) taken out.
- Today many pregnant Hebrew women are dying in childbirth and even being beaten by cops. In Nigeria women who can't afford the fees for giving birth in hospitals are being locked up. The enemy is afraid of who we will give birth to. **We need midwives today!**
- As Women of Yah we must refuse to obey Pharaoh's decrees.
- Who is willing to be a midwife for Yah today, protecting Yah's people?

## A Poem for Passover



- When we read **Exodus 6: 6-9** in Hebrew we read that the Hebrew slaves were so oppressed they could barely breathe—or even hear—what Moses was trying to tell them:
- For this reason, say unto the children of Israel, I am Yah and I will bring you out from under the Burdens of the Egyptians and I will free you out of their bondage. I will take you to me for a people and I will be your Yah and you shall know that I AM, which delivers you out from under the burdens. But when Moses told this to the Israelites, 'they could not listen to Moses, because they were short of breath and impatient due to the burdens of the labor'. Exodus Chapter 6:6-9 (translation based on the original Hebrew)

# A Poem for Passover

# A Poem for Passover

- Ethiopian Hebrew women stage #BlackLivesMatter Protest in Israel demanding their rights as modern day Zipporah's and Esther's.
- I can't wait! I can't breathe! I can't wait! I can't breathe!
- Historians are uncovering that slave masters would not allow the enslaved to hear the Exodus narrative because almost all slave rebellions were led by black preachers who read the Hebrew Bible. There is scholarship that shows that some slave masters would even go as far as to create a slave bible with the Torah removed so slaves couldn't access the Exodus text.
- In this place, during this time, we are reclaiming and unveiling these stories.
- Can you wait? Can you breathe? I can't wait because I can't breathe!
- Then I remember the Ruach, the very breathe of the Creator, is available to all of us, great and small, slave and free, and I breathe...will you join me?

# Next Year The New Jerusalem! Yah Your Kingdom Come!

- Today the Hebrews are in captivity again in new Egypt's scattered across the world, but in scripture we are promised a Greater Exodus:
- **Jeremiah 16:14-15** Therefore, behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that it shall no more be said, Yah lives, that brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt; But, Yah lives, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north, and from all the lands whither he had driven them: and I will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.
- Three main themes of Exodus are: 1) Yah proving to Egypt and Hebrews that HE is Elohim which is why all plagues correspond to Egyptian deities. 2) Rebirth-fleeing Egypt and not looking back and crossing the parted sea all represent rebirth-you can't go back into your mother's womb you leave and can't look back & we go through Mikvah or Immersion when we are being reborn in Messiah or after the birth of a child, our nation was born in the Exodus. 3) Compassion which in Hebrew is connected to the womb, Justice now we as Hebrews must ensure NO one is ever oppressed the way we were.
- The commandments we received in the wilderness were about breaking our slave mentality and establishing a nation of justice: **Numbers 15:18** wear fringes in the ancient world all elites wore fringes in Yah's nation everyone great and small is commanded to wear them because we are equal before him. **Exodus 23:9** don't oppress a stranger because we were strangers. **We are a nation of justice.**

## Next Steps



- As we prepare for Passover remember to examine yourself and cleanse yourself of the leaven or sin in your life. Repent, apologize, restore and refocus.
- Make a list of sins (Leven) you need to repent of this Passover Season.
- Make a list of people you need to liberate through forgiveness this Passover.
- Physically clean your home of leaven. Buy food you can eat during Passover and The Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- Read the Book of Exodus and thank Yah for how he has liberated our people and cry out to him to deliver us again through sincere prayer.
- Read Song of Songs and remember our marriage covenant with Yah and how much he loves us.

## Next Steps

- Donate to or volunteer with an organization fighting for justice for genetic Hebrews or an organization dedicated to ending human trafficking or mass incarceration which is modern day slavery.




